Black History Month

During February America celebrates African-Americans' impact on America, their history and culture. In Black History month we celebrate people like Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King Jr and more. Below are some facts about some people who made a big impact on our daily life. This week we would like to celebrate Jackie Robinson, Coretta Scott King, James Baskett, Claudette Colvin and Madam C.J. Walker.

Jackie Robinson was born in Jan 31, 1919. He played four sports: Baseball, Basketball, Football, Track. He met Branch Rickey and got on the Brooklyn Dodgers becoming the first African American to play Major League Baseball. He played his first game for the Dodgers on April 15, 1947. People would be very rude to Jackie and tried to hurt him but he did not fight with them. He was still calm even when he got death threats. He worked hard and was the rookie of the year. Then fans liked him. When he retired at age 37 in 1956 from professional baseball teams had different races playing. Jackie Robinson broke the racial barrier in Major League Baseball

Martin Luther King Jr's wife Coretta Scott King was born on April, 27, 1927. She was an activist and stood for black lives. She joined NAACP and founded the King center. She was also part of the Bus Boycott and did many other events and gave many speeches. She had four kids. She also went to jail for fighting for black live. Coretta died in Jan, 30, 2006 at age 78.

James Baskett was the first black male to win an Academy Award. James Baskett was born in Feb, 16, 1904. When he finished High School he got offered to be a little bit in a show. He accepted the offer and played in other small shows then he went to New York City and stayed in Lafayette Players Stock Company for many years. In 1948 he won his award and died in Jul 09, 1948.

At age 15 Claudette Colvin was coming home from school and was forced to give up her seat to a white woman in the bus. She refused to and got arrested. Claudette Colvin went to trial. Nine months after Claudette Colvin, Rosa Parks refused to get up too! Claudette started a revolution.

Madam C.J. Walker (1867-1919) was the first Black woman millionaire in America and a great philanthropist. She worked as a single mother for \$1.50 a day to send her daughter to school. She later started her own beauty company and created the "Walker system". She was brilliant in marketing. She sold the image of a new life-style and hair culture. She used "before and after" photos to sell her products. Within five years her company had 3,000 agents. She trained them well and gave awards to saleswomen for their sales performance but also for their charity contributions. She left 2/3rd of her fortune to charity.
